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## OVERVIEW

AzCHER-Central is a coalition of public health, health care, pre-hospital, and emergency management organizations that collaborate to prepare for, respond to, and recover from an emergency or disaster affecting the health care sector.

Funded through the Assistant Secretary for Preparedness and Response's (ASPR's) Hospital Preparedness Program (HPP) as a subawardee under the Arizona Department of Health Services (ADHS), AzCHER-Central serves the central region of the state including Gila, Maricopa, and Pinal Counties. The coalition's service area covers more than 19,000 square miles and is home to nearly 5 million people.

## PLANNING

Goal 1: Enhance "systemness" through strengthened partnerships by enhancing communication and coordination pathways and increasing multi-disciplinary membership

- Introduce participants to HSEEP planning, conduct, and evaluation methodologies
- Discuss best practices in developing and maintaining training and exercise programs at the hospital/health care facility
