
Emergency Management 101

Overview

This course will provide students with an introduction to basic Emergency Management concepts and practices, especially within the context of hospitals and other health care providers. Additionally, Emergency Management 101 will provide an introduction to exercises as a means of enhancing preparedness.

Learning Objectives:

1. Introduce participants to AzCHER Central and provide networking opportunity with peers
2. Provide an overview of key hospital/healthcare emergency management concepts, including the regulatory environment, exercising, local health department and community partnerships, and educational resources to guide planning, response, and recovery activities
3. Provide an overview of peer response entities within the region and overarching roles and expectations in emergency planning and response
4. Provide participants with resources for facility emergency management programs and emergency management training and education

- Hospital/Healthcare Emergency Managers new to the field
- Members of ancillary or adjacent programs that interact with their facility Emergency Management teams (e.g. Safety, Risk Management, Quality Improvement, Physicians, Emergency Department)
- Emergency Management students or interns
